INTERVIEW

Words of a guide: Guruvani questions for a principal

What are the three most important focus areas (roles) of Principal (in context to Indian schools)?

As a Principal, my first important role is to be an academic leader. ensuring that the curriculum is delivered effectively, remains relevant and aligns with the guidelines of the National Education Policy 2020, while promoting innovative teaching methods. My second role is to be a people manager, supporting teachers, staff, students and parents, listening to their concerns, guiding their professional growth and fostering a sense of belonging in the school community. The third important role is to act as a visionary and institution builder, planning for the long-term growth of the school in terms of infrastructure, academic excellence and cultural values so that it remains relevant and inspiring in a changing world.

How do you empower teachers to be leaders?

I empower teachers by giving them responsibilities along with the freedom to make decisions about how to conduct programs and activities, allowing them to exercise creativity and professional judgment.

Teachers are entrusted with leadership roles in various areas such as coordinating mock parliament sessions, overseeing house competitions, guiding literary competitions, managing the magazine committee and organizing special assemblies and I make it a point to appreciate their efforts publicly.

Teachers are encouraged to take on leadership roles by accompanying students on international trips such as the NASA program in the USA and the German Link Program, where they guide, mentor, and represent the school on a global stage. Above all, I focus on building trust so that teachers feel confident to voice their ideas and opinions without fear of judgment.

Pedagogy is changing by leaps and bounds every year. How do you keep pace with it?

I make it a habit to learn continuously by attending webinars, reading educational research journals and networking with fellow educators. I organize teacher training sessions

that focus on modern teaching techniques such as blended learning, AI integration and experiential learning. I encourage teachers to consistently monitor how students are responding to different teaching techniques by conducting regular assessments of various kinds that evaluate their analytical skills, oral abilities, practical implementation of theories and overall understanding.

How do you inspire/motivate students to take up sports as it is a vital part of school education these days?

I work to create a sports-positive culture where achievements in sports are celebrated as much as academic accomplishments. I ensure that a wide variety of sports, both competitive and recreational, are available so that students with different interests can participate. Students are trained in football, handball, cricket, athletics, carom, chess, etc.

We regularly share students' sports achievements on the school website and parent groups to encourage and appreciate achievers. We run an NCC program to promote discipline and fitness. We organize regular interhouse sports competitions to build

healthy competitive spirit and provide specialized coaching opportunities for students who show potential in specific games. Our well-trained marching band instills coordination, discipline and pride, while our adventure camps offer students a unique experience of outdoor activities that build resilience, teamwork and confidence.

How do you build a positive school culture or climate?

I involve both staff and parents in the decision-making process so that everyone feels a sense of ownership towards the school. I maintain a culture of appreciation by recognizing small and big achievements alike. I ensure clear and transparent communication so that expectations are well understood. I keep an open-door policy where teachers and students can share their concerns freely. I integrate value based education into everyday activities.

What are the skills which is must learn for students as extra-curricular activity in today's competitive environment?

In today's competitive environment, it is essential for students to develop digital literacy and understand online safety. They must also learn public speaking and effective communication skills. Financial literacy should be introduced at a basic level to prepare them for adult life. Critical thinking and problem-solving skills are vital for their future careers. Students should also engage in creative pursuits such as art, music, dance and theatre to encourage imagination. Finally, awareness of sustainability, through activities like gardening, recycling and community service, is becoming increasingly important.

Your profession has many challenges. What, in your opinion, is the toughest?

The toughest challenge I face is balancing the expectations of management, teachers, parents and students while keeping the best interests of the child at the center of all decisions. Another major challenge is delivering high-quality education despite limited resources, especially in contexts where budgets and infrastructure are restricted.

What is your approach to student discipline?

My approach to discipline is to maintain a highly structured and orderly environment where students understand clear expectations for their behavior at all times.


